The Manna Conejo Valley Food Bank was founded in 1971 by a group of people who felt that no person should ever go hungry in the Conejo Valley. Until recently, it operated for the past 50 years out of a 700 square foot house in the Old Town area of Thousand Oaks. Organized by Cathie Loeb as chair of the Missions Committee, a group of 11 people from UMCWV were able to tour Manna's new home on March 13.

Located at 95 N. Oakview Drive, the new facility has 7,000 square feet of space for its pantry, food storage and sorting, classroom and office space. Donations can be dropped off Monday – Friday, 8 a.m.–4 p.m. and Saturdays from 9 a.m.–1 p.m. People needing food can pick up some on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. A. A Qualified Charitable Contribution

(QCD) is a distribution made from an Individual Retirement Arrangement (IRA) to an eligible charitable organization, such as UMCWV. The distribution must be made payable to the charity. If you receive your distribution check made payable to UMCWV before sending or giving the check to the UMCWV church office, you may wish to write in the memo section of the check all of the funds and amounts you wish your allocation to go to. For example, Operating Budget fund #101, Apportionments fund #112. You may also give a note to the church office about your allocation wishes.

The QCD option is available regardless of whether an eligible IRA owner itemizes deductions on <u>Schedule A</u>. Transferred amounts are not taxable, and no deduction is available.

Please check with your tax advisor or financial consultant to ensure that you meet the requirements for giving a QCD.

Ministries of the church happen through the faithful efforts of its lay people.
