PASTOR'S PONDERINGS: "Waiting"

'Waiting' is an interesting concept, at least it seems to be these days. My images of waiting from years ago involved needing rides and not having a cell phone. We didn't always have these tech boxes in our pockets, so you might end up wait ing a bit. It was kind of how it

worked; life moved a little differently. Today there really aren't times that I'm waiting anymore. That's just cell phone time. I have a couple of sports and puzzle sites I like. And there's always social media. Yeah, we don't wait, we just take scroll time, mostly. Our worship series for November is about this time in the Christian year where we're waiting. We're waiting until we can get to Advent... the season of waiting. So, we're waiting to wait... if that makes sense.

It is an interesting thing to consider, though. We spend a lot of time in our culture looking for ways to eliminate waiting. We get online for a lot of our shopping. It helps us to avoid the waiting, the crowds, the bustle. We order early from the coffee shop so we can just go in and grab it. It's good, toothe dangers of human inaction, and all. The other day I asked a person how he was doing. He had the nerve to tell me! Doesn't he know? "How are you?" is just something you say! Sarcasm aside, I do wonder what would happen if we looked at waiting in a different way. With more intentionality, waiting can become a time to anticipate, maybe even to prepare.

The Advent series is called "Surely the Days are Coming." It's a journey through some lesser-known texts in the Old Testament. They help us to look at the value of taking that time to envision what lies ahead. What is it that's coming? How will we be challenged? How might we be blessed? I trust our time together will be blessed this month!

A Word from the Finance Team...

Thanks to everyone for your heart and time during stewardship month. We've been navigating a nuanced message to the congregation. Things are good and growing. God is clearly with us and our UMCWV ministries. But we are not yet right-sized financially.

We've been living in faith that the church would respond and it has. After Pledge Sunday we have 49 pledges for 2026. Over half of those have upped their pledge from this year. So, this is good news indeed.

Returning pledge cards will continue through the next month or so, and we fully expect to reach last year's 69 pledges - and maybe even more. If you haven't yet had the opportunity to turn in your pledge, you can do so in the Sunday offering plate or the church office during the week. There are pledge cards in the Narthex and the church office.

Once again, we thank God for the inspiration and guidance. We thank you for your response.

As everyone should realize by now, October was **Stewardship Month** at UMCWV and the theme **People Get Ready** was used, with sub-titles for each week. Oct. 5 was **World Communion Sunday** and

thing Godly, so are we ready to welcome them and become what they're looking for?

People Get Ready is the title of a song originally sung by The Impressions, with lead singer and its composer Curtis Mayfield, in 1965. Many others have recorded it since then, including Rod Stewart and Jeff Beck. It uses the **metaphor of a train** to represent hope for a better future, as it was written during the Civil Rights Movement. That's why there was a replica train with photos of church members, and Pastor Darren as the conductor, in front of the altar all month. On Oct. 12, retired UMC Pastor Lanny Arrowsmith gave the message while the Cowdrey family was on the East Coast for the wedding of Joseph & Maddy. Titled Ready and **Grateful**, it was about gratitude that, Lanny said, is stewardship – saying thank you for blessings and kindness received. Let the ripples flow from you to others as you willingly pay your gratitude forward. Donna, Katy (and Kiki) shared in leadership and liturgist roles, and Charles gave a stewardship moment. 

EMT Matthew Christie from the LA Fire Dept. is the teacher and would appreciate having at least 5 people in each class.


Certification is good for 2 years, and \$25 is a special rate Matt gives to the church. You pay him at the class, by cash or check.

New this year:

Vicky's Scholarship Fund (Many Mansions) - While Many Mansions provides affordable housing in Ventura Co., this fund awards its residents an opportunity to go to college or pursue vocational training by providing scholarships to graduating seniors and hard-working parents. Since it's inception, it has awarded scholarships totaling \$250,000. This past June, 42 recipients were awarded scholarships to uplift their dreams and ambitions.

Meals on Wheels (Senior Concerns) - For 50 years, Senior Concerns has provided home delivered meals, both hot and cold, to seniors in our community who are unable to cook and shop for themselves, along with a friendly check-in by volunteers who deliver the meals.

NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) - This organization is dedicated to building better lives for the millions of Americans affected by mental illness. It provides resources, support and advocacy. For each donation made, you will receive a card and insert describing the organization. These cards make wonderful gifts for family, friends, and colleagues.

Starting Nov. 9 and running through Christmas, someone will be available on the patio after church to take your order and answer questions. We look forward to seeing you!
