While doing some reading for fun... yeah, I do read for fun sometimes, I came upon an article explaining what people used to do before we had cellphones. Some of you might remember those times. Today we work real diligently to remember our phones, just in case we end up having to wait somewhere.

Heaven forbid we end up somewhere, waiting for an appointment or a ride with nothing to do but... wait. The list of things we used to do isn't very long, though. Usually something like, carry a book. What I came to realize is that we often just figured out what to do when we ended up waiting. Maybe we looked around some shops or got a snack and drink somewhere. Maybe we just "people-watched." The point is, when the time came to wait, we just waited.

As we enter advent, this idea of waiting as a part of life is much more foreign. We have ourselves organized really well, so we don't end up waiting. This begs the question, what do we do with a season in which we're supposed to 'wait;' and even 'wait' really well?


Our theme in worship is "All the World Waits." We'll be using different scriptures to help us prepare for Christ's coming, but also to wait well. If we want this birth that anchors our faith to have weight in our lives, we should craft time in our lives and hearts for God to fill. So we look, with intention, for the signs of Christ's presence, both now and in the presence to come. Make sure to join us on Sundays to make this advent journey all that God would have it mean for you.

Finally, our book study this year is called "Advent in Four Words." It's a daily devotional as well as a weekly gathering in which we walk through the traditional words of Advent that mark each Sunday: hope, peace, joy, and love. The devotions are written by our own UM bishops and should add a deepening to the journey this advent. (I apologize for the confusion with the advent study book. I have no other excuse besides making a mistake.) I like that we've found a book with a daily as well as weekly devotion for us. I hope you'll join us this year.

Greetings from the finance and stewardship teams! Here's a quick report on our 2026 pledging and budget setting for 2026. At this point we've matched last year's pledging for the Church's main budget at \$362,000. With a few more pledges still to be turned in, we have hope for a bit more increase before it's all said and done. As we look to get more right-sized, we look to grow a little past the cost of living realities each year. At the same time our pledging toward apportionments for the conference is up. This is a good sign of support for the organizational and missional work of our denomination. We thank you all for your heart for UMCWV and we continue to encourage you with the words "People, Get Ready," as we look to the new year!

Charge Conference Report

Our Charge Conference on November 22 turned out to be a really nice opportunity for the mission area churches to gather. It is nice to remember one of the high values of our particular brand of Christianity: Our connection to our sister and brother churches. For UMCWV in particular, we tabled a number of issues related to our budget and our leadership structure until this January. The budget projections will be more accurate once we have 'year-end' data to work with. Our movement to a "Leadership Council" model got off to a fast track. So, ironically, we want to slow it down and make sure all have learned what they want to learn and can then vote in good conscience. Please keep your eyes open for an extra Charge Conference to be called in late January to complete our work.










Kwanzaa is an annual celebration of African-American culture from 12/26 to 1/1, culminating in a communal feast called *Karamu*, usually on the sixth day.




